Welcome

A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE OFFICER

This Term the college is taking steps to consolidate on its hard work and commences investing in 'place'. The tagline "Where you need us" is very important and the college takes a lot of pride in our small country - based campuses. This term we will be formally announcing the development of new bespoke campuses in Inverell and in Moree to meet the needs of our students and the business community. This investment will enable us to deliver better training and create spaces for the development of learning communities. A big part of our work is breaking isolation and making learning a normal part of adult life and creating place-based solutions to this is key to our strategic development.

During Term 1 the staff (some are pictured on the front cover) have participated in some new initiatives including training within the Narrabri High School, a Paddock To Plate program at Bingara hosted by The Living Classroom and an outdoor skills youth program in Moree called Backyard and Beyond where students worked on a Botanic Garden project. We also continued the development of our Engineering - Fabrication Trade programs including commencing the training of apprentices with BOSS Engineering at Inverell on site; alleviating the cost and stress of apprentices having to travel for their training. The college is a leading provider of Community Services training and our 2019 intake has been very strong particularly in aged care and disabilities streams. I need to thank the organisations that provide excellent work placement opportunities for our students which very often result in employment.

We were able, through successful lobbying to achieve some funding for drought affected farming families to undertake accredited training in Term 1 which was very well subscribed - particularly first aid, forklift, confined spaces, white card and working at heights. Our drought assistance programs were also mainly sold out and thank you to donors, organisations and trainers involved for their creativity and giving to this important program.

Of course, without the dedication of the voluntary Board none of this would happen; and of course the trainers who travel many kilometres to deliver training where and when it is needed and the administrative staff that underpin everything that we achieve. FUNDING OPTIONS

Smart and Skilled

Under Smart and Skilled the NSW Government contributes to the cost of each course with the student paying the balance. To be eligible for Smart and Skilled Funding you must be:

- 15 years old or over; and
- no longer at school; and
- living or working in NSW (or an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person living in specific NSW border areas); and
- an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, Australian permanent humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen; or
- a NSW apprentice or trainee.

Community Service Obligation ‡

Funding under Smart and Skilled is provided by the NSW Government to assist learners who need extra support or assistance to access training.

Eligible learners include:

- Australian citizens/permanent residents or humanitarian visa holders who have very low literacy, language and numeracy levels
- people with limited employability skills
- people who are unemployed or underemployed
- students with a disability
- students who are Commonwealth welfare recipients
- young disadvantaged students who need assistance transitioning to further study
- people who have other barriers to Smart and Skilled entitlement.

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes, who provide support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing.

Workers promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

To complete this qualification, students must complete at least 120 hours of work experience at the Certificate IV level to allow all competencies to be assessed on-the-job.

There is a need for a Federal Police Criminal Record check in all disability organisations. The College recommends prospective students obtain a Police Record Check prior to commencement to ensure industry visits to workplaces can be approved.

HLTAID003 Provide first aid

This course is for anyone who is required to provide an advanced first aid response, life support, management of casualties, the incident and other first aiders, in a range of situations, including in the home, workplace or within the community, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.

This is valid for three years but the CPR (HLTAID001) component must be renewed every year.

You will need to complete a workbook prior to course commencement, these can be collected from your Community College.


